Why Do We Eat Pancakes Before Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is February 14th this year. Another "holiday" is also celebrated on February 14th, but that is another article. Traditionally on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, Episcopal and Anglican churches serve pancakes for dinner to their congregations and communities. People usually ask, "Why pancakes?"

Beginning on January 6, The Feast of Epiphany, in New Orleans, Louisiana, Carnival begins. This is a time of celebration, merry making, and eating well. Carnival begins on January 6 and continues until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. Some years Carnival is almost two months long. This year it is only five and a half weeks. The word Carnival derives from Latin—carne levare—meaning "remove meat". The tradition comes from church expectations that determined what foods were not supposed to be eaten during Lent. People were expected to eat up all the meat in their freezers/storerooms.

Since Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, all the "good" foods had to be consumed by midnight on Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday is often overlooked, being considered "The Day Before Ash Wednesday", but Shrove Tuesday is important in its own right. It is a transitionary day moving God's people from the season of Epiphanytide to the season of Lent. The word Shrove comes from the Old English word "shrift", meaning to confess one's sins. Churches would ring their bells on Tuesday evening letting people know that it was time to go to church to confess one's sins before Lent began. Not only did you have to confess your sins, but you had to consume all the foods not appropriate to eat during Lent.

But why pancakes? Different cultures celebrate with different types of high-fat breads made with eggs and milk. Mexico and Spain make what we call French toast. France celebrates with a King Cake. Germany and Poland serve doughnuts filled with cream or jam, while the Ukraine makes a thin pancake known as blini. In England and other parts of the United Kingdom they serve pancakes, which is why Anglicans/Episcopalians make pancakes, and eat them with butter, syrup, fruit, whipped cream, peanut butter, chocolate chips, whatever you like.


St. Matthias has found that it is easier to celebrate Shrove Tuesday by serving pancakes after church on Sunday instead of on Tuesday evening. That seems to work best for us.

So, on Sunday, February 11, 2024, right after church, be prepared to fellowship and, in the Anglican tradition, eat pancakes. BUT WAIT!!! THAT'S THE DAY OF THE SUPER BOWL!!!

Yes, it is, but the Super Bowl doesn't begin until 5:00/5:30, and pancakes will be done (clean-up and all) by 1:00. So, join us for some pancakes and fellowship.
