They voted for board and committee members, the annual budget, and listened to ministry reports. I loved seeing Council through the eyes of JoAnn who attended her first Council. I couldn't hope to adequately explain to anyone what they would experience, until they see it in person. Her eyes were lit up, she had the biggest smile and just soaked in the loving experience being surround with hundreds of Christians. Karen was able to share our prayer shawl and bracelet ministry and even helped the military ministry turn 2000 feet of Paracord into 400 survival lanyards for our military and first responders. I gave the Small Church Ministry report to the delegates and a presentation for attendees of the small church dinner. Anyone can attend the Annual Council every February as guests and 2 members will be delegates. As we approach Easter, I pray you'll attend our Holy Week services and experience Jesus' Passion in these special and unique services.

Palm Sunday, March 24th, 10:30am

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and Jesus' Passion on the cross. Palm branches will be distributed and waved during the procession. The liturgy of the palms will start outside the church then we'll process into the church. For the Passion gospel, some folks in the congregation will have specific roles to read with the congregation taking the part of the crowd.

Tenebrae, Wednesday, March 27th, 6:00 pm

The service is centered around psalms, readings from Lamentations, and responsories. There are fifteen lighted candles. One candle is extinguished as each of the fourteen appointed psalms is completed. The fifteenth candle, symbolic of Christ, is left lighted at the end of the final psalm. But it is carried away to be hidden, which signifies the apparent victory of the forces of evil. A sudden loud noise is made at the end of the service, symbolizing the earthquake at Christ's death. The lighted candle is then restored to its place, suggesting Christ's eventual triumph.

Maundy Thursday, Thursday, March 28th, 5:00 pm

It comes from the Latin mandatum novum, "new commandment," from John 13:34. The ceremony of washing feet was also referred to as "the Maundy." Maundy Thursday celebrations also commemorate the institution of the eucharist by Jesus "on the night he was betrayed. Following this, the altar is stripped and all decorative furnishings are removed.

Good Friday, March 29th, 12:00 pm


We'll commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus. It's a day of fasting and special acts of discipline and self-denial. The liturgy of the day includes John's account of the Passion gospel, a solemn form of intercession known as the solemn collects.

Easter Sunday, March 31st, 10:30 am

Holy week culminates with the feast of Christ's resurrection. We will joyfully acclaim throughout the Easter Season, The Lord is risen, the Lord is risen indeed in celebration of the mystery and miracle of Easter. We will have a flowering of the cross and an egg hunt for the children after the service.

Bishop's Warden's Wanderings

"Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore His sacred name." This hymn (number 473), written by George William Kitchin (1827-1912), is the 2024 theme for the Diocese of West Texas. Bishops usually choose a verse from scripture as the annual theme, but Bishop Dr. David G. Read chose the opening line of a hymn. At first, I thought that strange but then as I looked at the hymn again and thought about the words, I found that he could not have chosen a better theme.

As Christians it is our responsibility to lift up the cross, an instrument of torture and execution that Jesus over came on Easter Sunday through his resurrection from the dead. The empty cross is a symbol of hope for us as it shows that death is not an end, but a beginning. As we Lift High the Cross for ourselves, we also lift it for others through our actions and words.
